Leadership to advance the University of Denver's (DU's) mission, strategic imperatives, and public good vision through community-university collaboration; and the strategic vision and success of the Center for Community Engagement to advance Scholarship and Learning (CCESL), Center for Sustainability, and Learning Communities Civic Engagement. Advise the Vice Provost for Academic Affairs on strategy, tactics, and operations related to community-engaged initiatives.

Director, Center for Community Engagement to advance Scholarship and Learning (CCESL) (2011-2021)

Leadership of a team of five full-time staff who work with faculty, staff, and students across the university to advance community-engaged research, creative work, and teaching. Examples of achievements include:

- Led multiple strategic planning processes since 2011, which resulted in the articulation of mission, values, and vision as well as strategic goals that have been implemented, assessed, and refined over time;
- Championed community-engaged research, creative work, and teaching across the University, reflected by CCESL's support of faculty and students from all degree-granting units at the University as well as national recognition such as through the 2015 Carnegie Community Engagement Classification;
- Supported the development of diverse programming to advance community-engaged research, creative work, and teaching/learning across faculty, staff, and student constituents. For example, co-developed an intensive 2-day workshop on community-engaged teaching that is offered annually and has reached nearly 200 faculty from across all degree-granting units to date; oversaw development of fellowship and grant opportunities for faculty, including the annual distribution of the \$100,000 Public Good Fund for faculty;
- Developed processes for tracking and communicating the impact of CCESL programs, such as through the *Public Good Impact* newsletters and End of Year reports.

Chair, Department of Psychology (2015-2019)

Leadership of a department comprised of more than 30 faculty in tenure track, research, teaching, and clinical lines, 5 departmental staff, more than 500 majors and 150 minors, and three graduate

programs with more than 40 graduate students in residence; championed the importance of psychological science in the liberal arts and to the University's research agenda. Examples of achievements include:

- Led the Department's first strategic planning process, which resulted in the articulation of mission, values, and vision as well as a five-year plan;
- Oversaw the first two years of implementation of the strategic plan, including annual reporting on plan progress to constituents. As part of the strategic plan implementation, implemented organizational changes, including the establishment of new leadership tracks within the Department and revision of approaches to service;
- Oversaw the development and refinement of Department bylaws, including revisions to Appointment, Promotion, and Tenure criteria to increase transparency in review processes as part of a commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion;
- Oversaw the revision of faculty and staff hiring procedures to increase diversity, equity, and inclusion, which resulted in hiring 13 faculty in four years;
- Managed the Department budget and successfully advocated for resources, such as new teaching faculty and teaching assistant lines as well as start-up resources for faculty; explored new revenue streams through continuing education;
- Led the development of external-facing communications to engage alumni and the public, such as through a quarterly newsletter and semi-annual Psychology and the Public Good events;
- Led the development of a fundraising plan for the Stress Early Experience and Development (SEED) Center.

Co-Leader, Collaboration for the Public Good Working Group, DU IMPACT 2025 (2016-present)

Leadership of a group of faculty and staff charged with developing strategies to implement the public good vision laid out in the University strategic plan. Examples of achievement include:

- Co-led the development and implementation of DU Grand Challenges, a university-wide initiative designed to bring together university and community collaborators to improve daily living, increase economic opportunity, and advance deliberation and action for the public good. A diverse suite of programming engages faculty, staff, students, community members, and alumni.
- Oversaw the development of external funding proposals for DU Grand Challenges, which have resulted in \$400,000 in foundation awards to date;
- Championed anchor institution work, illustrated by leading the DU team that was part of the inaugural Anchor Learning Network of the Coalition of Urban and Metro Universities (CUMU) and the Democracy Initiative.

- Contributed to university strategic planning and implementation as an active member of the DU IMPACT 2025 Steering Committee (August 2016-present) and Transformative Directions Advisory Committee (March 2015-Summer 2016) as well as the only faculty member appointed to the DU IMPACT 2025 Strategy Executive Committee from 2018-2019.

- Contributed to interdepartmental and inter-unit initiatives and activities, such as the development of a four-unit collaboration around mental health (DU CARES) (2018-2019, current) and as co-Chair of the search for a new Dean of the College of Arts Humanities and Social Sciences (CAHSS) (current).
- Mentor in the Values-based Academic Leadership Trajectories for Women in STEM (Vaults): The Northwest Regional Partnership, funded by NSF, to Dr. Kathryn Becker-Blease.
